How to survive your coming year

What does 2011 hold for you? Are big problems looming ahead? Are you worried you could get hurt? Life can be like a rough competitive sport. Even your friends around you can help you only so much. Every time you take a step towards your goal, your enemies bring you down to earth with a thud.

American football players know the dangers of getting hurt 'out there'. As one recalls: 'I played scholastic American football for ten years. I wasn't especially big as far as football players are measured, and I often got hurt by blows from bigger players and hard contact.'


Yet that young player, never once in ten years, missed a game. 'For although I was often hurt, I was never injured. I was competitive and durable. I have strong bones and a hard head!' As 2011 gets underway, how can you make sure that you will be like him - strong and durable? How do you keep going when life's problems tower over you?

This American football player is also a Christian, and he has found: 'If you turn to God, and put your trust in Christ, then though you may often be hurt, your deep inner self will never be injured – never harmed. God's people are not sheltered from being attacked or hurt, or even from physical suffering and untimely death from martyrdom. But we are kept from injury to our spirits and our faith.

'lesus teaches us that the way to overcome fear of our circumstances is to have faith in him - to trust in his love and care and seek to honor him as our Lord. Throughout the gospels, Jesus commands fearful people to replace fear with faith, as when he rebuked the fear of the disciples in the storm (Matthew 8:26).

Faith in Christ is a powerful force! It subdues our fears and enables us to trust that even though we don't know what the future holds, we know who holds the future. God doesn't initiate evil in this fallen world, but he does allow it, and it can hurt! But if you turn to God, he will transform your problems into occasions for helping you grow. Then you may be hurt this coming year, but you will NOT be harmed.'

White chocolate, lemon and raspberry muffins

Archbishop's message to Christians in Iraq

The Archbishop of Canterbury has issued a message to Christians in Iraq, following the killings in Bagdad at the end of last year. ' have repeatedly highlighted the plight of Christian minorities in Iraq, and the need for them to enjoy a dependable freedom of conscience, religion and worship, to flourish as minority communities. and to contribute to the common good of Iraqi society. But the killing of worshippers at Our Lady of Salvation Church in Bagdad has demonstrated a new low point of Christian vulnerability in the country. This slaughter of unarmed people gathered in church to worship God is a shocking and disgraceful act that should be utterly condemned by people of all faiths and none."

Left out in the cold

A member of a certain church, who previously had been attending services each week, stopped going. After a few weeks, the vicar decided to visit him. It was a chilly evening. The vicar found the man at home alone, sitting before a blazing fire. Guessing the reason for his vicar's visit, the man welcomed him warily, led him to a big chair near the fireplace and waited. The vicar made himself comfortable, but said nothing. In the grave silence, he contemplated the play of the flames around the burning logs.

After some minutes, the vicar took the fire tongs, carefully picked up a brightly burning ember and placed it to one side of the hearth all alone. Then he sat back in his chair, still silent. The host watched all this in quiet fascination.

As the one lone ember's flame diminished, there was a momentary glow and then its fire was no more. Soon it was cold and dead and dark. Not a word had been spoken since the initial greeting. The two men sat on in reflective silence.

A little while later, just before the vicar was ready to leave, he picked up the cold, dead ember and placed it back in the middle of the fire. Immediately it began to glow once more with the light and warmth of the burning coals around it. As the vicar reached the door to leave, his host said, "Thank you so much for your visit and especially for the fiery sermon. I shall be back in church next Sunday."

Grave certainties

As a bagpiper, I play many gigs. Recently I was asked by a funeral director to play at a graveside service for a homeless man with no family or friends. The service was to be at a cemetery some distance away. As I was not familiar with the area, I got lost, and finally arrived an hour late.

The funeral director and hearse were long gone. There were only the diggers left and they were eating lunch. I went to the side of the grave and looked down. The lid was partially covered with soil. The diggers stared at me over their sandwiches, and I sensed their reproach that I had deserted this dead man in his final hour of need. I didn't know what else to do, so I started to play.

The diggers looked quite startled at this, and put down their lunches. But they stood quietly enough while I played out my heart and soul for this man with no family and friends. And as I played 'Amazing Grace,' the workers began to weep. They wept, I wept, we all wept together.

When I finished, I packed up my bagpipes and started for my car. Though my head hung low, my heart was full. As I opened the door to my car, I heard one of the workers say, "I never seen nothin' like that before and I've been putting in septic tanks for twenty years."

Apparently I'm still lost....

Mission of the Month



The Leprosy Mission

Contrary to popular belief, leprosy is a mildly infectious disease, which is neither hereditary nor caught by touch.

Leprosy is caused by a bacterium which is related to the tuberculosis bacterium, or TB germ, and scientists believe it is passed through droplets of moisture carried on the air, from someone who has leprosy but has not yet started treatment.

Leprosy is most common in places of poverty, and those subjected to dirty surroundings, overcrowding and poor nutrition are more susceptible to leprosy infection.

Sadly this age-old disease, closely associated with biblical times, is still without an effective preventative vaccine, but is curable with multi-drug therapy (MDT).

Many people are terrified of catching leprosy and some even see it as a curse, and diagnosis of leprosy can lead to divorce, loss of work, home and friends.

Early detection and treatment with MDT are therefore vital and after only a couple of days on treatment, sufferers are no longer infectious. Though the disease is surrounded by myths, stigma and fear, leprosy is more than a medical condition and delay in diagnosis and treatment can lead to serious disability.

The Leprosy Mission is a worldwide Christian organisation active in over 50 countries with a vision for a world without leprosy and a passion to eradicate the causes and consequences of leprosy.


