Packing away the Christmas Lights



Twelfth Night, on 5th January, is when we should stop celebrating Christmas and take down the decorations and lights.

The following day is Epiphany, when we remember the arrival of the wise men to worship Jesus. Each Christmas, in our living room, the three kings are moved slowly along the window ledge towards the crib beside the Christmas tree. Predictably, they always arrive just after the Christmas decorations, lights and tree are taken down; just in time to be packed up with the nativity set and put away with the lights and decorations in the loft for the next eleven months.

Outside in the January cold, without the Christmas lights which have decorated houses and the streets for the last month or more, it feels very dark and wintry. It seems a long time until the clocks go forward, the evenings get lighter and we begin to anticipate Spring.

Over the centuries, the brief biblical reference to the wise men has been added to; wise men have become three kings with names, identities and specific gifts. This easily hides the deeper truth of the original story. Epiphany is about the non-Jewish world discovering Jesus and worshipping him. The God previously only known by the Jewish people, is revealed through Jesus to the wider world. Without the Christmas lights we are reminded what a cold and dark place the world can be, but we still celebrate Jesus revealed as the light of the world.

During our worship in January we look at some of the promises that God made to the Jewish people; promises of



a world that would focus on justice, peace and righteousness. We see Jesus beginning to fulfil these promises for the whole world; Jesus as the light of the world. There is still darkness, but Jesus is the light that can guide us through the darkness; a light we can share with others who are lost or seeking the way. Jesus is a light that can't be overcome by the darkness; a light that God wants to share with everybody.

Remembering



Ann Gimson

Ann was born Elizabeth Ann Morris on 12th June 1926 in Birmingham. As a child she was given her choice of name, and chose Ann.

At the time of her birth, Ann's father was a Church of England Priest. He was a dedicated pacifist and had become Chairman of the Peace Pledge Union, following his friend and colleague Canon Dick Shepherd. Ann remembered members of the Union such as Bertrand Russell, Vera Brittain and Sybil Thorndike coming for meetings.

Having initially wanted to study Medicine, she went to Kings College Hospital to study Dental Surgery, having been advised that the first year of this course was similar to that of Medicine and it might be possible to swap courses. However, she fell in love with dentistry, and gained her degree, the Wallis Prize for preventative dentistry and her Licentiate in Dental Surgery in 1949.

Ann first taught at the Dental School at Kings, and then joined the Metropolitan Police as a Dental Surgeon in 1951.

Ann and Arthur Gimson (better known as 'Gimmie', a lecturer in the Prosthetics Department at Kings) were married in 1953. They lived in the Wimbledon area before moving to St Mary's Avenue in 1959

For a short time Ann worked in her father-in-law's dental practice, keeping it going following his death until it could be sold. Jillian was born in 1957 and Carolyn in 1960. Ann went back to teaching part time at Kings in 1966 including a year running the Hygienist course until a permanent teacher was recruited. She retired from dentistry in 1979 when Gimmie became unwell.

On Gimmie's death in 2004, Ann stayed in St Mary's Avenue until 2009 when she moved to sheltered accommodation in Blenheim Court: she spent nine years in its friendly, caring and kind community. When her health deteriorated, something she found difficult as she valued her independence, Ann moved to be closer to her daughters.

Ann loved reading, crosswords, music and poetry and the theatre before her mobility and hearing made these visits more difficult. In her younger days, she was an enthusiastic ballroom dancer. She loved to travel: she visited her brother in Florida several times and attended the Oberammergau Passion Play. Her one regret was that she was never able to visit the Holy Land.

Ann became a regular member of St Mary's in 1962, joining first the Young Wives, becoming its leader for four years as well as being a member of the Mothers Union. She became the first ever woman churchwarden at St Mary's, before being encouraged to train as a Reader, and was licensed in June 1979. Whether it was leading prayers, preaching or taking funerals, she always strove to make things relevant, personal and accessible to all.

She was always there to lend an ear or provide advice, available for anyone in need. She took great joy in serving at St Mary's until she finally retired as a Reader Emeritus after 35 years, although she continued to help out with services at Durham House and would organise the Christmas Carols at Blenheim Court.

Her faith meant a great deal to her and upheld her through bad times and good as did her fellowship with so many loving and faithful friends.

Many people have reason to be grateful for the love Ann showed, for her stoicism in the face of ill health, for her patience, encouragement, service and inspiration. She used all her senses in the service of her beloved Lord and of us at Shortlands.

Juniors on song!

St Mary's Junior Choir are a real asset to the choir. Where possible they sing at all Sunday services, including Choral Evensong once a month, and at all Christmas and Easter services. In addition they get the chance to sing at some of our great Cathedrals such as Rochester, Southwark, St Edmundsbury and Exeter.

The Juniors start at the age of 6 to 7 and go up to age 18. They rehearse from 7-8pm on a Thursday and are joined by the adult choir at 7.30pm. They learn to read music, following the Royal School of Church Music training scheme ('Voice for Life'). Once a year they get an opportunity to win the Paul Baker Friends' award.

The Junior Choir receive a small payment each term for their commitment to the Choir and are a really fun bunch of children to be around.

Many parents and members of the congregation have enjoyed seeing the children performing at special services such as Harvest and Mothering Sunday, or at the Pre-school end of year services.

Pat – how can we thank you enough? For all your hard work, loving care of the children, all the outings, capable leadership, and yes, for wading through all that paperwork. You leave a wonderful legacy for our new leader Christine Hall.

Mission of the month

The Leprosy Mission

There are presently over three million people suffering from leprosy-related disabilities. A new case is diagnosed every two minutes and more than 200,000 new cases were diagnosed globally in 2016 - more than 60 per cent of which were in India.

Sadly, despite continuing laboratory research, there is still no specific vaccine against leprosy. However, a cure in the form of multi drug therapy (MDT), which has been freely available since 1982, will, within a week of commencement of treatment, prevent patients from spreading the disease. Treatment with MDT in the early stages of leprosy will avert disabilities including possible blindness and paralysis, but early diagnosis and treatment is essential and many sufferers are slow to seek treatment.

The consequences of the disease can be devastating for those who go undiagnosed and untreated. Fear and stigma associated with the disease can lead to social exclusion which can be more damaging than the physical symptoms.

Discrimination against people affected by leprosy continues and only recently in 2018 a Bill was passed in India amending the law by striking out leprosy as a ground for divorce.

The Leprosy Mission, founded in 1874, is a leading international Christian organisation transforming and empowering the lives of people affected by leprosy. It is a charity that has been supported by St Mary's for many years.
