

God with us

I started writing this after taking down the Christmas decorations on 6th January or 'Twelfth Night'. This date is associated with the three Wise Men bringing gifts to the baby Jesus and is the beginning of the season of Epiphany in the church calendar. The word 'epiphany' means 'manifestation' or 'appearance' and people may talk about having an 'epiphany moment' when they are suddenly struck with a life-changing realisation.

The season of Epiphany continues through January. In the Church of England the season ends at the beginning of February, for some other churches it continues until just before the start of Lent. In all cases there is a theme of 'epiphany' as individuals begin to recognise something of who Jesus is and try to get to grips with what that means. For the wise men he is the Messiah, God's anointed one. For John the Baptist, urging people to transform their lives, the adult Jesus is revealed as the beloved Son of God. For Simeon and Anna the baby Jesus, brought to the temple by his parents just like any other first-born son, is a light for the whole world, the fulfilment of what they have been waiting for all their lives.

It is easy to assume that these moments of realisation were immediate and complete, but I suspect the reality was very different. None of these individuals would have understood fully who Jesus was and what his coming really meant for the world, but in all cases they marvelled at God being present, 'God with us', rather than some remote abstract concept.

'God with us' or 'Emmanuel', one of the names given to Jesus, reflects the amazing claim at the heart of Christianity that Jesus is both human and divine, vulnerable and yet all powerful, present alongside us, loving each one of us, understanding our struggles and confusion as well as sharing in our joys.

This claim applies here in Shortlands just as much as 2,000 years ago in Palestine. At St Mary's church, placed as it is in a central position in the Shortlands community, our prayer is that we may live out our mission, shown at the

top of this page. May this help us all in our individual 'epiphanies' as in the words of St Paul in 1 Corinthians: 'For now we see through a glass, darkly; but then face to face: now I know in part; but then shall I know, even as I am known'. **Catherine Bingham**

The course will take place over six weeks and we will be looking at the following topics:

February 25 + 26 (Week 1): The Mystery of Good and Evil

March 10 + 11 (Week 3): The Mystery of Sin, Suffering and Hope

March 17 + 18 (Week 4): The Mystery of Relationship and Reconciliation

March 24 + 25 (Week 5): The Mystery of Love and Sacrifice

March 31 + April 1 (Week 6): The Mystery of Joy and Salvation

This course will help us to rediscover what it is that draws us so deeply in our search for God. We will follow Jesus through the Lenten readings, allowing him to bring us in love and wonder into a greater Please join us at St. Mary's as we prepare for Holy Week and Easter: understanding of God's plan of salvation.

In each session there will be opportunities for discussion: an inspiration to those who are perhaps wanting to learn and understand more about their own faith and for those who are looking and searching, with challenges too for those who are well used to April 9th - Maundy Thursday 8pm - Eucharist of the Last Supper studying scripture.

The sessions will take place twice a week, Tuesday evenings at 8pm and Wednesday lunchtimes at 11.30am in the Millennium Chapel at St Mary's.
