
Celebrating Easter in Church

The Coffee and Chat on Zoom is now at 12 noon. The link is available from the parish office - office@stmaryshortlands.church


Monday to Saturday, 9am Morning Prayer

More than 30 people took part in our recent Lent course on Zoom. The course, “Opening the Scriptures”, explored the relationship between God and human beings through stories in Genesis and Exodus. We thought about God’s glory as revealed in creation, human relationships looking at Jacob and Esau, and love and sacrifice through Abraham and Isaac. The course offered interesting paintings, videos and music to aid our reflections. It was helpful to consider some questions in small groups, to explore and learn together and to get to know each other a little better.

Christian Aid Week
