# Christ who came to the edge

Often I like to think of Christmas as cosy: a time for beautiful warm lights. I like to get an additional set of fairy lights every year, to add another reminder that the light of the world is coming at the darkest time of the year. However, when I reflect on Christmas in the Bible, we find something far more surprising. Something which was not cosy and warm, but radical and very much on the edge of society. Malcolm Guite, a poet and a priest, writes in one of his many Christmas poems:

"Christmas sets the centre on the edge;

The edge of town, the outhouse of the inn,

The fringe of empire, far from privilege

And power..."

The stable was not warm and cosy, it was not the place expected for a birth. Especially not for a long-awaited Kings of Kings who would save the world. Bethlehem was not the heart of the empire. The very first visitors were those forced to live on the margins. Jesus was born not in safety or privilege, but in vulnerability.

Christmas is about God coming to those on the edge, the overlooked, the judged, the vulnerable and the weary. That's where light first broke into darkness, and where it still shines. When we look around our world today, there are still plenty of forgotten people who feel unseen and ignored. Places where fear or loneliness have settled in. Homes where Christmas might be a struggle this year. This is precisely where Christ comes: not to the centre of things, but to the edges, bringing light, hope and peace.

We are all called to bring light, to show Jesus' love and joy wherever we go. We are also called to notice those on the edge. This Christmas, may the Christ who came to the edge meet you in the quiet corners of your life. All are invited to come and reflect on this at St Mary's at any of our services. It will be a joy to celebrate Christmas with you this year.

### Informal worship at St Mary's

At St Mary's we are blessed to have a variety of different types of services, including the traditional 10.30am communion which takes place on most Sunday mornings. This is usually led by our choir, led by Director of Music Claire Tillotson.

Three people spoke briefly about their life experiences. We agreed it can be really difficult to feel joy when you're in the middle of a crisis or the sadness of a major life event. Having the support of family and friends, including church friends, can make all the difference to how one gets through life's traumas.

In the closing prayer we asked God to be near us, and to comfort those who cannot sleep because of illness, worry or fear, or for reasons they cannot understand.

Lucy died in 1978 without completing the book: F G Marshall Ltd have now completed the work. The book is now in St George's chapel in church, in a new display case, generously donated by Betty Rider in memory of her husband Brian.

### St Mary's Toddler and Baby Group

The church is not just busy on Sundays! On Thursdays it's full of noise and young children as our baby and toddler group is held at the back of the church. We welcome babies as well as children up to five years of age.

The ethos of the group is to provide companionship and support for parents and carers of young children. There is a variety of play materials to promote both social and constructive play. We have a regular craft table, play dough and home corner. In the summer we extend the play area to the church garden. There is always a singing session followed by refreshments for all.

The crafts often reflect the church year. We have an informal church service at the end of each term, often with a puppet story, and in the summer we have a party with a bouncy castle and ball pond. We encourage people to bring a picnic and stay most of the day.

It is very much a drop in place of welcome and there is no need to book as we realise that life can be difficult to plan with young children. The sessions run from 9.30-11.30am and 12.30-2.00pm on Thursdays during term time.

The group is run by volunteers, many of whom have attended themselves with their children in the past. The more volunteers we have, the more interaction we can offer to the children and their carers. We welcome extra helpers as it can be quite busy.
