# Love changes everything!

February sees red roses and hearts adorning shop windows in readiness for Valentine's Day on the 14<sup>th</sup>.

So, who was St Valentine? Born in Italy, he served as a priest in Rome and was possibly the former Bishop of Terna, Umbria. Valentine, whilst under house arrest by Judge Asterius, discussed his faith with him and the validity of Jesus.

The judge put Valentine to the test, asking him to restore the sight of his adopted daughter. Valentine prayed hard to God, and laid his hands on the girl's eyes, and her vision was restored. The judge was astonished and he, with his household, converted to Christianity and was baptised. Valentine ministered to persecuted Christians but Claudius II ordered him to renounce his faith. Valentine refused and was executed on 14<sup>th</sup> February 269.

Legend states that, before his execution, Valentine wrote a note to Asterius' daughter signed 'from your Valentine', which is said to have inspired today's romantic missives!

Valentine's love for God saved a young girl's sight and supported persecuted Christians but lost him his earthly life. Throughout the Bible God showed his love for his people, the whole of humanity. God loved us so much that he sent His Son, Jesus, as a baby, to be our role model through his earthly life, throughout which He showed his love for God, his Father, in all that he did. This led to Jesus ultimately losing his earthly life at the hands of the Romans, just as Valentine did 300 years later. But Jesus rose from the dead, to bring salvation to all humanity, as Valentine did through his witness to God's love.

# Commemorations

2025 marks the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of the Second World War with two key dates to remember: Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> May and Friday 15<sup>th</sup> August. Victory in Europe (VE Day) is the day the German forces surrendered to the Allied powers and Victory in Japan (VJ Day) marks the day Japan surrendered in 1945, which in effect ended the Second World War.

We at St Mary's are intending to commemorate these events. On May 3<sup>rd</sup> we will be opening the church to a display of memorabilia related to the events of World War 2 and how it impacted the residents of Shortlands. As the original church was destroyed in that war, only those killed in World War 1 are named on the Shortlands War Memorial. The church does however hold a list of local armed services and Civil Defence personnel and Shortlands civilians who died in World War 2, and some of these will be especially remembered. It is hoped that in the future we may be able to fund the installation of a memorial board remembering them.

There will be displays in church from Saturday May 3<sup>rd</sup> to Sunday May 11<sup>th</sup>. We also plan to hold a ticketed tea party on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> May at 3.00pm: further details will follow.

Another date for the future this year is November 20<sup>th</sup>. The original church of St Mary's was severely damaged by a landmine on September 21<sup>st</sup> 1940 and then extensively damaged by a doodlebug at 1am on July 22<sup>nd</sup> 1944. Yet another bomb landed on the junction of Kingswood Road and St Mary's Avenue on July 27<sup>th</sup> 1944. The church was demolished in 1948, rebuilding started in 1953, finished in1955 and it was consecrated on November 20<sup>th</sup> 1955.
