Immersive church

Immersive experiences are now a popular theatre genre. At the recent Van Gogh event, people were crying. The combination of paintings, music, tragedy and overcoming was overwhelming. The virtual painterly journey through the fields and villages poignantly evoked the life of the troubled genius.

The Church year also provides immersive experiences as the bible narrative unfolds. Mary and Joseph travel to Bethlehem, the wise men visit from the Orient and Jesus walks to his death on the cross.

The events comprise colour, symbolism, spoken words, singing and music. Advent and Lent are sombre and purple; the music of solemn cadence. This is uplifted by the vibrant gold and white of Christmas nativity and Easter resurrection.

Our emotions are sharpened by a sense of complicity as the adoration of the Christ child turns to betrayal and death. The crowd that cries 'Hosanna' on Palm Sunday hollers 'Crucify him' on Good Friday. The palm crosses we held aloft are burnt to make the ash crosses on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday (22 February this year).

Holy Week starts on Palm Sunday (2 April). We walk the Way of the Cross, to the green hill outside the city walls. We are ashamed as our feet, like the disciples', are washed by Jesus on Maundy Thursday (6 April), we keep watch in the garden as the disciples desert Christ one by one, we flinch at the piercing of cruel nails on Good Friday (7 April).

These immersive experiences cause us to face the frailty of humanity: infidelity, fickleness,

Remembering

Melanie Jones



Melanie spent nearly all her life in Shortlands. Much of that time was in Druids Way where Tim and Gill Dawson were neighbours. Melanie worked for many years in publishing: when Revd. Gary Best came to St Mary's they discovered they already knew each other from those days.

Eighteen years ago Melanie decided to re-train as a Community Musician at Goldsmiths College. She loved working with older people and people living with dementia. She ran programmes with the Royal Palaces, The Bach Choir and Age Exchange in Blackheath as well as her choir at Ben Curtis Park in West Wickham.

Malcolm and Melanie's daughter Raven was baptised at St Mary's and attended Brownies and Guides. They became regulars at St Mary's after lockdown after they had so enjoyed the online services.

Mel was diagnosed four years ago with cancer, which was initially cured but returned in late 2019. Her courage and determination, and the prayers from St Mary's, kept her going with a very good quality of life for most of those four years.

In 2021 Mel was so well that they moved to Charing in the Kent countryside, which was her dream. When there were no local services they always tuned in to St Mary's.

Melanie appreciated the support she got from St Mary's and loved the welcoming atmosphere of the church and hearing the choir.

A new mission

Last August, your parish church embarked on a journey of self-reflection to create the future direction for St Mary's. I hope you had an opportunity to add your thoughts to the 'graffiti board' at the west end of the church. We were blessed by honest and insightful comments, not all of them easy to read.

It's official!

Did you know that St Mary's has some people in official roles, in addition to the Vicar, who play an important part in the management of the church and its activities?

Kate Buchanan and Marion Westropp are our churchwardens. They share with the vicar a responsibility for the good order of the church buildings, fabric and worship, which basically means being involved in a number of committees and related discussions. They also have a major role in supporting the vicar and caring for the congregation. Kate says: 'Fortunately much of the practical work to do with buildings and fabric can be shared with other church members, allowing more time for us to be involved in arrangements for services and other church activities. It is a privilege to do both of these, and so to be involved more deeply in the life and worship of the church and to share conversations with many of the people who join us for church services'.

Tim Dawson is St Mary's treasurer: 'I am responsible for the church's finances, making sure the accounting records are kept up to date, suppliers paid, debts collected and ensuring the accounts are presented to the PCC on a timely basis. I need to make sure there is aways enough cash to pay our debts and that the church's assets are safe'.

Jay Sharma is the secretary of the Parochial Church Council. The role involves managing the secretariat for the PCC, ensuring good governance at all times. This includes taking minutes, ensuring policies are up to date, advising on risk management and holding and updating the church electoral roll. Jay says: 'I intend to uphold this role according to the rules and regulations of the Diocese'.

Time for reflection

As Rev Kustner says, Lent is a time for preparation. Join us to share in reflections and discussion about our faith, and our place in the world as we prepare for the joy of Easter. There will be small groups meeting weekly throughout Lent (between 22 February and 6 April) – no prior knowledge of the Bible necessary. MISSION OF THE MONTH

Bromley Homeless

In Bromley there is a great need to find shelter for those living and suffering on our streets. Bromley Homeless provides friendly, confidential and supportive advice. It also offers many other free services to those of 18 years of age and over, such as liaising with the council, finding affordable accommodation, or preventing eviction. In the winter months there is emergency accommodation, with local charities donating food. There is also support for those with medical and psychological problems.

In 2022 volunteers gave 7,500 hours of support. Without these volunteers the charity could not exist, so if you would like to join them please email volunteers@bromleyhomeless.org Even an hour a week can make a huge difference to those in need.

Due to shortage of accommodation, guests are housed in hostels where they remain for a limited period until they find work. Each guest has a social worker who applies for funds from the council for accommodation. Once moved in, guests have basically four walls and a roof. The Starter Pack Scheme provides bedding, toiletries, crockery, and pots and pans. Bromley Relief in Need can provide funds for beds and white goods if the guest is not eligible for other support. Fair Trade at St Mary's



St Mary's Shortlands is registered with the Fairtrade Foundation as a Fairtrade Church. The Foundation is an independent organisation that checks that fair trade standards have been met by farmers, workers and companies that are part of the product supply chain. To reassure consumers that this has happened, they license the use of the fair trade mark on products and packaging.

Many producers, especially in developed countries, are paid a fair price for their goods and their working conditions are reasonable and safe. Sadly this is often not the story in many parts of the world. Can the people that have grown the rice for my meal afford clothes and to send their children to school? Do they have enough to eat? When I buy fairly traded rice I know that the producers have been paid a fair price, their working conditions are safe, no child labour has been involved and it has been grown sustainably with the environment in mind.

By using our power as consumers we can make a direct difference to so many of the most disadvantaged workers in the world: they get a decent wage for the decent work they do so they can live safely, have enough to eat, pay for their children to be educated and above all have dignity in life.

At St Mary's we are celebrating Fairtrade Fortnight (February 20th to March 5th) by holding the famous 'Big Brew' in the Community Café on Wednesday 22nd February. There will be delicious home-made refreshments made with fair trade ingredients, fair trade tea and coffee will be served and there will be a raffle and quiz with prizes. Our fair trade stall will also be set up for you to browse.

At St Mary's we have a stall of fair traded goods twice monthly: after the 10.30am service on a Sunday (about 11.30am) and on a Wednesday morning at the café. Please look at the noticeboard or pew paper for dates.
