#### **Farewell to Marion**



St Mary's recently bid farewell to Marion Westropp, a longstanding member of the congregation.

The Westropps - Marion, John and sons Charles and Peter - moved from Islington to Scotts Lane in 1986. Looking for a church, they fortunately settled on St. Mary's. Marion resumed working for the NHS and the family became involved with many aspects of church life.

John began the Beaver colony in which Marion assisted until she swapped noisy little boys for more genteel Brownies. Marion's love of singing led her to join the choir and later, the Music Group. She assisted with Youth Club, even venturing on two camping holidays which she has erased from her memory!

She continued on her faith journey by qualifying as a Pastoral Assistant, assisting at Wednesday communion services and at Durham House and administering Home Communion. She also led many Home Groups, participants being welcomed by a golden labrador.

Marion's dedication to Welcare is widely known: fundraising quiz nights with John as quizmaster were enjoyed by many. New Bromley Mayor Cllr Dr David Jefferys presented a certificate to Marion from the Bishops of Southwark and Rochester and Bromley Council recognising her 35 years' service to healthcare, pastoral work and as a volunteer for Bromley Welcare.

Marion said she felt 'so overwhelmed' by the kind tributes she thought she'd been to her own funeral and it was a 'cracking eulogy'. Her final 'swansong' was during the service when the choir sang an anthem accompanied on the baby grand piano which Marion had gifted to the church.

Sadly, both Peter and John have died but Marion is moving close to son Charles and his family to begin a new chapter in her life. We wish her well!

### St. John's Penge



The third in the series of churches in the Beckenham Deanery is the notable and Grade II listed church of St. John the Evangelist, Penge.

The architects Edwin Nash and John Nash Round were involved in the design of the Gothic Revivalist church which opened in 1850. Nash made further additions: the gabled north and south aisles in 1861 and then the transepts, a new chancel and an extension to the nave in 1866.

The construction was originally funded by John Dudin Brown, a Thames Wharfinger (a keeper of a wharf). There is a local 'Thames link': the Royal Waterman's Almshouses, close to the church but built earlier in 1839-1841, were for workers on the Thames. Edwin Nash also designed the St. John's Cottages Almshouses in Maple Road, built in 1863-1864.

The church was considered worthy enough for an entry in the Pevsner Buildings of England series which commented on the 150ft West tower with its 'broach spire'. This is a fascinating design where a square based tower becomes a tapering octagonal spire by the use of triangular faces.

The Historic England register lists many of the church's impressive architectural features, particularly the addition in 1910 of the King Edward VII window in the north aisle. The king was a direct descendant of Earl Harold Godmisson, the first known Earl of Penge. The window was designed in the style of Edward Burne-Jones, fabricated by William Morris & Co. and includes images of Temperance and Hope.

St. John's embraced a new and exciting future when it combined with Holy Trinity, Lennard Road in 2021. It is known for its community outreach: to facilitate this the church interior was reordered to provide a flexible space for community use in addition to its role as a place of worship. St. John's offers support to the community by working with Christians Against Poverty (CAP), a national debt support and advice charity.

With Holy Trinity, St. John's also features on the Penge Heritage Trail (<a href="https://www.pengeheritagetrail.org.uk">www.pengeheritagetrail.org.uk</a>).

#### Parish news

At the Annual Parochial Church Meeting held on 19 May, James Hollingdale stepped down as churchwarden and was thanked for his service. Robin Hogg and Glo Sherman were appointed as churchwardens for the next year. Three new Parochial Church Council (PCC) members were elected: Ann Dalton, Craig Myers and Claire Tillotson.

The meeting was chaired by Archdeacon Allie Kerr who gave a brief and encouraging update to the congregation regarding the imminent advertisement for a new parish priest.

The members of the PCC were commissioned after the morning service on Sunday 26 May.

#### MISSION OF THE MONTH

#### **Breathe Arts (BREATHE)**

This charity is a social-enterprise, non-profit organisation started some 14 years ago by Yvonne Farquharson working in Guy's and St Thomas' Trust across many different areas. I first encountered it when awaiting a consultation in the calming presence of a harpist playing live music in the waiting area and I wanted to know more about its work. Briefly, music is used as therapy: physical and mental, and I would add spiritual therapy.

Initially singing was used for lung health and dance classes for balance. This could be applied for those with lung disease, stroke rehabilitation and so on. There is now a harmony choir and singing for women with post-natal depression as well as a two week summer camp in magic for children who need confidence building exercises – particularly those with cerebal palsy or hemiplagia. The difference those two weeks make is immense.

This is a small but very worthwhile charity and our support is greatly appreciated. Its approach is recognised as being scientifically proven – and approved. One of the first arts and health companies to be recognised by NHS England, the charity has worked across over 80 healthcare locations in the UK and as far away as Australia. The Guy's and St Thomas' Trust remains the main client. Breathe has co-authored medical journals, published books and contributed to government policies. #### **Our First Citizen**

In May, Bromley Council elected Cllr Dr David Jefferys – a longstanding member of St Mary's congregation - as its Mayor.

The role involves being the King's representative in the borough and fulfilling a ceremonial role at civic, London and national events. As well as chairing Council meetings, the Mayor speaks and presents certificates at Citizenship Ceremonies which take place almost weekly. There is rarely a day without an event, and some days there are four!

David reflected on his early days as Mayor: 'It has been humbling to see the wide range of volunteer groups across the borough, with many new groups being set up and older groups reinventing themselves and taking on new roles. I have opened two nursery schools and a Post Office, reopened the Croydon Recreation Bandstand, awarded health, community care and music festival prizes, attended Founders' Day at Bromley and Sheppard's Colleges and the installation of the new vicar of Christ Church, led the commemoration for the 83rd anniversary of the sinking of HMS Hood and events for D-Day – and much more. The calling of the General Election has meant some events have to be cancelled or postponed. On Election Day I will be the Returning Officer, announcing the results for the constituencies in Bromley.'

Each Mayor has a programme of events throughout the year to raise funds for their chosen charities: David has chosen Alzheimer's Research UK, BYMT (Bromley Youth Music Trust) and Welcare Bromley. He will run the London Marathon again to raise funds for these charities. His four themes for the year are: further promoting the sense of community and collaboration across our borough; encouraging more people to take ownership for health and wellbeing; promoting the environment and sustainability in the borough; and raising awareness of science and technology in all age groups. He will be supported in all of this by the Mayoress Ann-Marie and by the Deputy Mayor and Mayoress. #### Meet the churchwardens



At the Annual Parochial Church Meeting in May, Robin Hogg and Glo Sherman (pictured with Ven Allie Kerr, Archdeacon of Bromley and Bexley) were elected as churchwardens.

Both are well-established members of the congregation, but as they take on these new roles we thought it was time to find out a little more about them.

Robin has been worshipping at St Mary's since 1992 and was married to Helen in church in 2016. Recently retired, with over 40 years in retail and HR management, he has also served as trustee of a local mental health charity for 17 years.

At St Mary's he is perhaps most visible as the 'beardy bass' in the choir. He is also President of the Friends of St Mary's, Assistant Treasurer and a member of the maintenance team. He was previously a cub leader and chair of the Children and Youth Committee.

Robin described the role of churchwarden: 'It's to act as the link between the congregation and the vicar, and to ensure that the church is run in line with the expectations of the Church of England. I want to help the parish to survive and flourish during a time of change.'

Glo has been a member of the congregation for seven years. She plans and leads several services: Come Holy Spirit (a quiet, reflective service of readings, music and silence), Morning Prayer when a vicar is not available and occasional informal worship services planned with the Music Group, which she sings with. She is a member of the Pastoral Team and attends the Community Café most weeks to chat with those attending (she also bakes for the Café!)

Glo hopes that both during this time of the vacancy, and when a vicar has been appointed, she can act on feedback from the congregation and the vicar in ways that are effective, efficient and loving. She hopes to aid spiritual growth in the church family. She told us: 'I value the sense of community at St Mary's: it is a welcoming group of people.'

#### Seeking a new vicar

We are now progressing with the recruitment process for our new vicar. Catherine Bingham and Robin Hogg have been elected as the two members of the Parochial Church Council to represent St Mary's interests, working with Archdeacon Allie Kerr and other representatives of the Diocese.

The role was advertised in June and we hope to interview later this month. We will keep you posted.
